Early Signs of Autism In Babies and Toddlers



Child does not make eye contact when others engage with them.

Child does not smile back when others smile at them.

Child does not respond to his / her name or to the sound of familiar voices.

Child has difficulty following objects visually.

Child does not point, wave goodbye or use other gestures to communicate needs and wants.

Child does not make noise to get attention of others.

Child does not respond to or initiate cuddling.

Child does not imitate movements and facial expressions of others.

Child does not reach out to others to be picked up.

Child does not play with others, share interest or enjoyment.

Child does not ask for help when needed or make other basic requests.

Physician's Guidelines

No big smiles or other warm, joyful expressions by six months or thereafter

No back-and-forth sharing of sounds, smiles or other facial expressions by nine months

No babbling by 12 months

No back-and-forth gestures such as pointing, showing, reaching or waving by 12 months

No words by 16 months

No meaningful, two-word phrases (not including imitating or repeating) by 24 months **Any** loss of speech, babbling or social skills at any age

If these signs are seen in your child then it is important to get them to your Doctor for a thorough examination.
